

looked upon as irrelevant and "history" (argh, whoever thought our early lives would someday be considered "the old days"?!).

Yet as a writer, I understand why we all are curious about our classmates' lives. Every one of us has a unique story to tell. Whether reflecting on small achievements or tall accomplishments, by doing so we add another precious piece to the mosaic of our times—and each other. That's why I so love reading about you all, and why I finally said "Yes" to Pat.

Like many of our classmates who couldn't afford college, after graduation I started working downtown at The Pure Oil Company. Sequestered in a small, dull office, I filled my after work hours with part-time college courses, entering the TV/modeling/film industry and volunteering at the USO. Yet in September of 1959, by some quirk of fate, I was transferred to

Ironically, at the same time I had been offered some film "deals" in California. What to do? I chose D.C.

Back then, Washington was not only safe and fascinating, but a single girl's paradise. Many interesting hours were not only spent in the company of Richard Nixon and his staff, but also others ranging from Senator Everett Dirksen to even Miss America. I worked long and happy hours on the campaign, and was devastated when we lost to Kennedy. But, I was soon employed by a leading D.C. attorney, Abe Fortas (who was later appointed to, then released from, the Supreme Court). And yes, somewhere I still have tucked away my ticket to Kennedy's Inaugural Gala!

I later married, had a daughter and continued living on the East Coast until returning to Illinois in 1967. There I worked for several interesting organizations, including one developed by W. Clement Stone (insurance magnate and the originator of the famous Positive Mental Attitude). While working for IBM, I was transferred to Atlanta and lived there happily for the next twenty-six years, until finally ending up in Charleston, S. C.


Throughout the years, I've experienced a lot of love, laughter, loss and limitation. For example, in the early '80's I was diagnosed with a combination of Multiple Sclerosis and Fibromyalgia, which certainly changed my life and ambitions. To say the least, I am very fortunate to have a wonderful daughter, son-in-law, and super fantastic six year-old grandson. We all stay ultra busy, but God has been good to me, and I feel very blessed.

Only one thing is lacking. I haven't been back to Illinois since 2000, and I'm getting homesick. The last reunion I attended was in 1969 and at the time I left the celebration, some of you all were dancing on the tables...hmmm. So, I am anxious to come home in 2009 for our Fiftieth Reunion (I have a hard time comprehending that number!). 


has an oxygen tank with her at all times. She has been in and out of the hospital a lot over the past few years but has a wonderful outlook on life and the future.
