Colorado Chapter





A few of us recently decided that we wanted to cruise this fall. We have put an AHS Cruise together and as of today, 9 cabins are sold. Signed up so far are the Wakes' (8570); Neurauters' (9013); Snells' (3560); Yates' (3554); Born-Watts' (3552); Purvis' (8639); Plambecks' (3050); O'Connell-Olson (8568); and Ibbotson-Kelly (9611). We have a couple other "singles" that might be interested in sharing a cabin.

TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE! The fares for the cruise have dipped down, but will inevitably be headed back up soon. At this time, certain categories (most Ocean views \$885-\$910) can still be booked, but are not eligible to be in the group until they are booked. Same is true for some Inside categories. In other words, they can't be "held." Once booked through our agent, they can be added to our group.

<u>CABINS</u>: The AHS group holds (not by number, just category) the following:

Three E1 - Balcony Cabins: \$1,265 / person

(E3 has obstructed views. E2 were at the ends of the ship)

Five L - Inside Cabins: \$827 / person

(M, N were not eligible to be pulled into a group at this time)

We still have some "held" cabins and their pricing will not change until the surrender date, which is June 11. Any cabins that do not have deposits assigned will return to RCCL's inventory as of that date.

Everyone in our group will receive a \$50 on-board credit per stateroom. Deposits of \$500 per cabin are due upon cabin reservation. Final payments will be due by July 31, 2010. If you cancel before that date, you will get your deposit back with no penalty.

<u>DINING</u>: We have "My Time" dining at the moment. We hope to book an early reservation once the computer signup opens.

Below is Dwight's "Fish" story, with a picture to prove it all!

There was no wind the night before we went out. What had been water everywhere was ice

¼ to ½ inch thick. We broke ice everywhere until 11:30 in the morning. My friend caught a 6½ pound female at 11:40 in 25 feet of water. He was jigging Buckshot, which is an ice fishing lure. I caught the 10½ pounder, another female 15 minutes later jigging a Green Marabou Lead Headed jig. In the next 45 minutes, we each caught 23½ pound males. We have not been out since due to rain, wind and waves----typical March weather.




